There is currently a quarantine in place for 13 counties in southeastern Pennsylvania to try to stop the movement of the invasive pest, Spotted Lanternfly. This pest is a native of Asia, and could possibly work its way into our region. This destructive insect feeds on a variety of over 70 species of plants including hardwood trees, grapes, apples, peaches, ailanthus, hops and ornamental/landscape plants.

There will be a **testing session** held by the PA Dept. of Agriculture following the training for those who will need **permits** to do business/travel/transport goods in the quarantine area.

Agenda: This meeting will cover general information about the Spotted Lanternfly including: initial detection, biology and life cycle, current distribution, impacts of pest feeding, recorded damage, pathways for spread, and control methods.

We will also cover what to do if you find a SLF, quarantine, regulations/permits, & compliance.
